### PROPOSAL 2

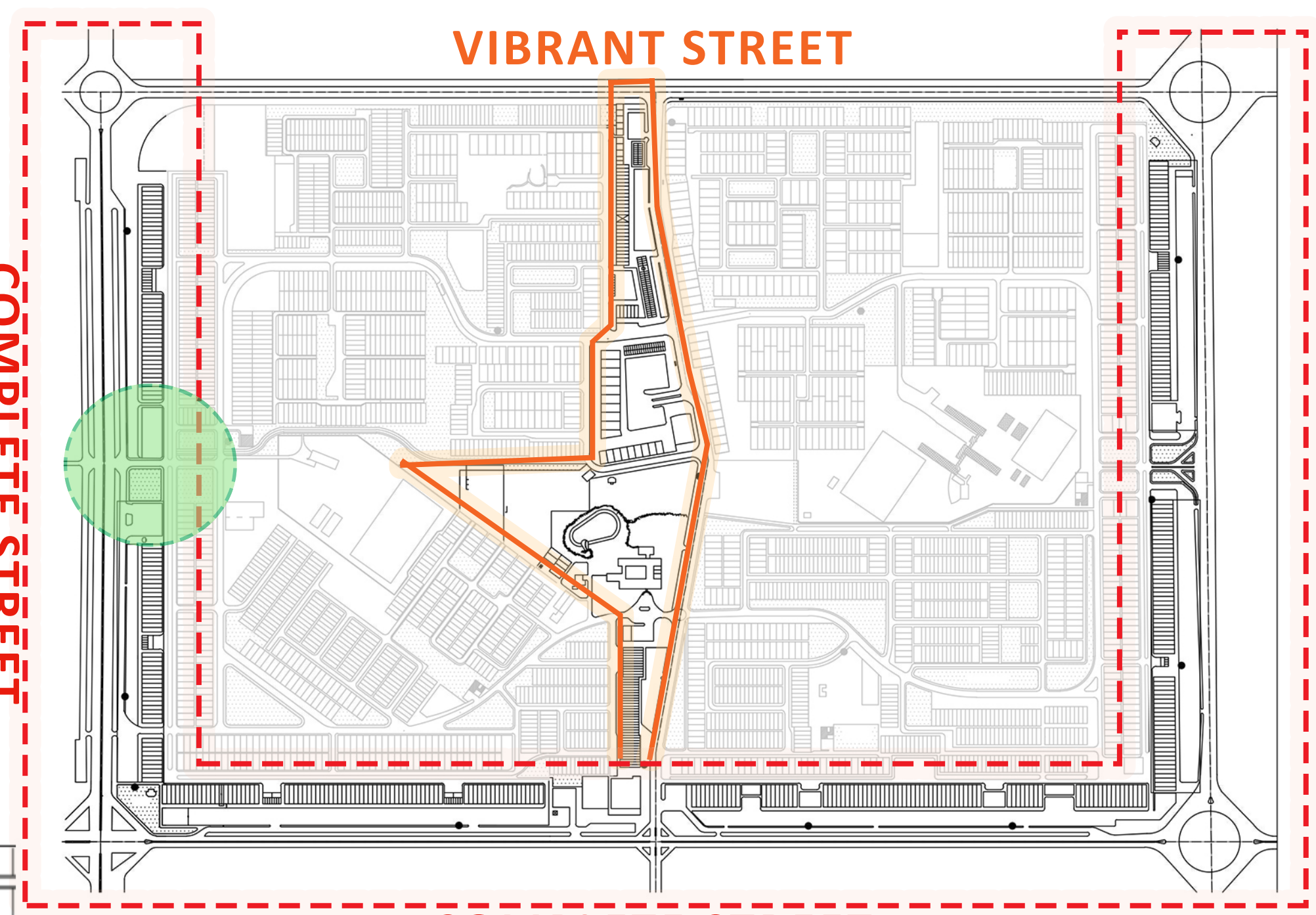
- Identified a pocket which already have a mixture of different activities happening -

- To RE- Create existing market into more functional and lovable space by proposing simple low cost improvements

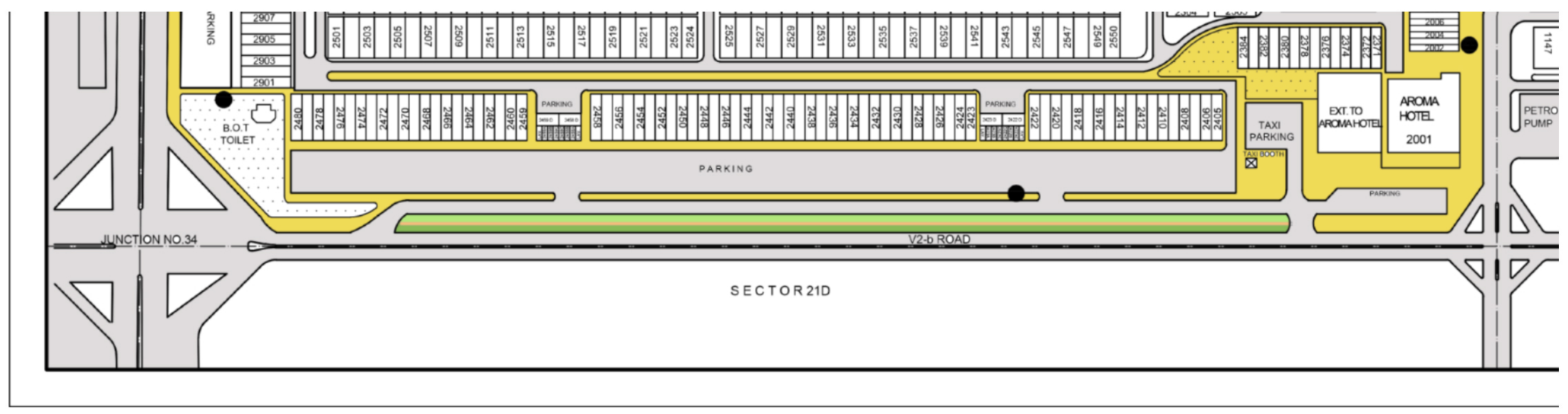
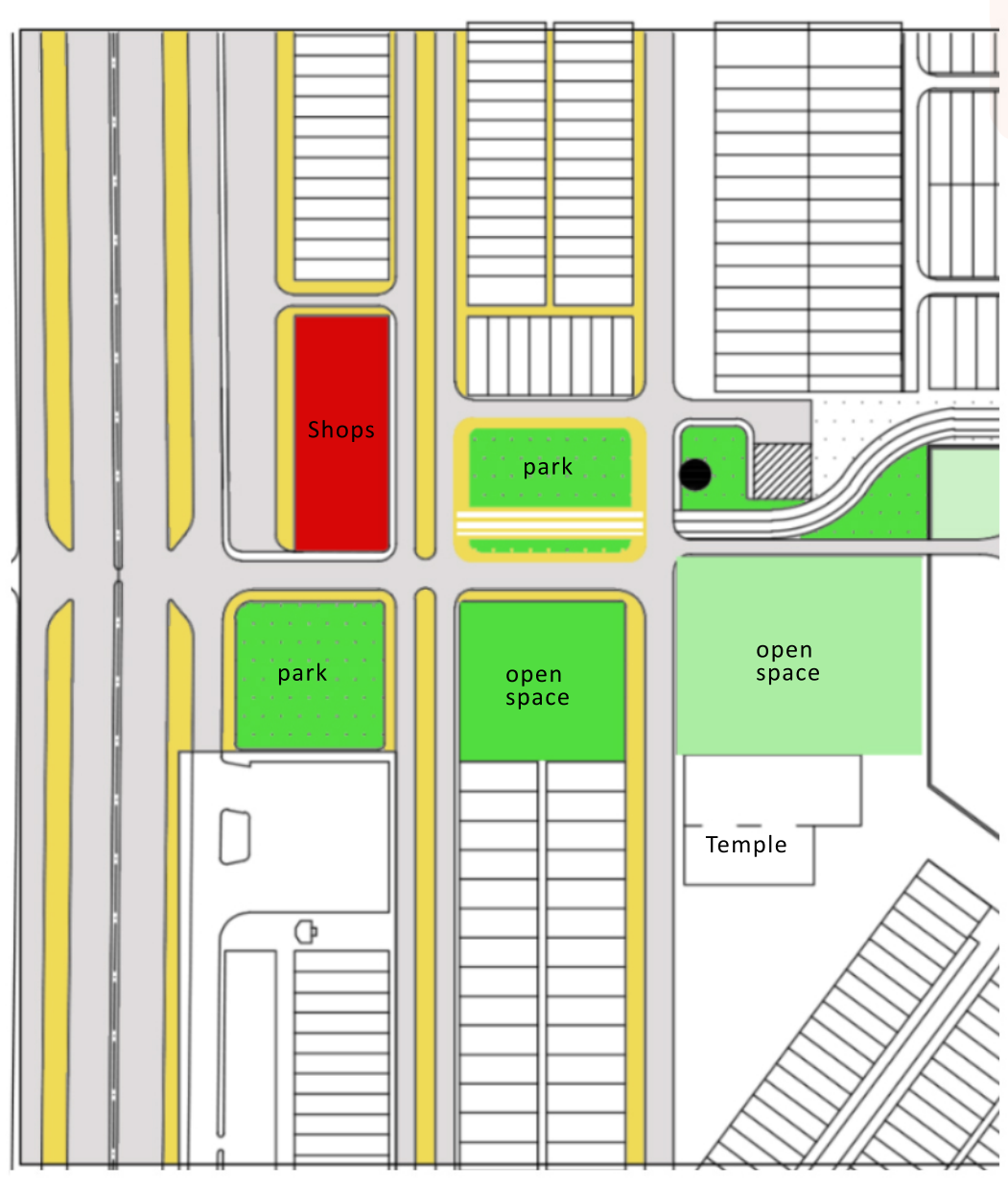
- To connect it with adjacent parks and open spaces to give people more space to sit, eat, walk and play.

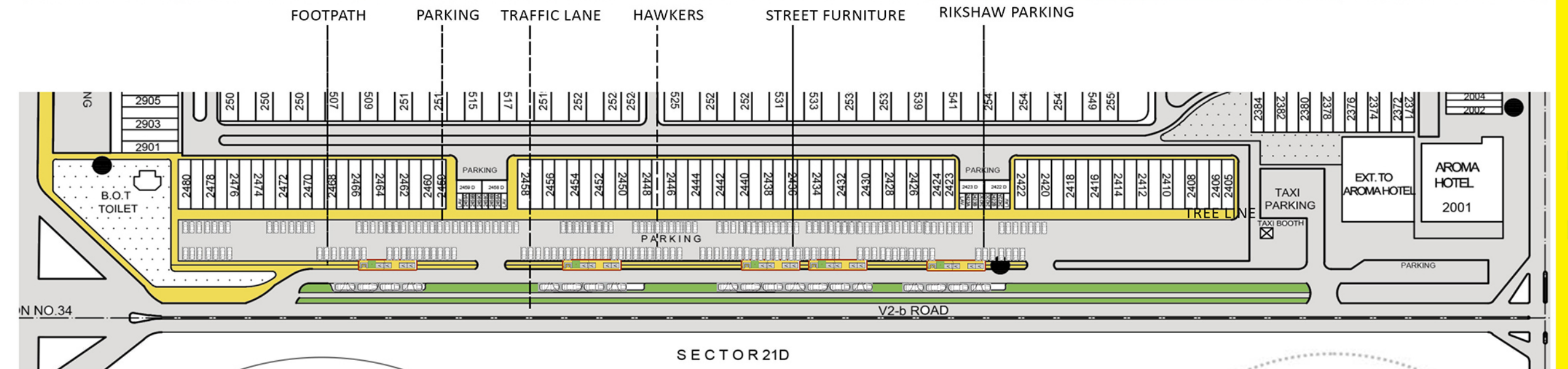
### people's PERSPECTIVE

### Why?

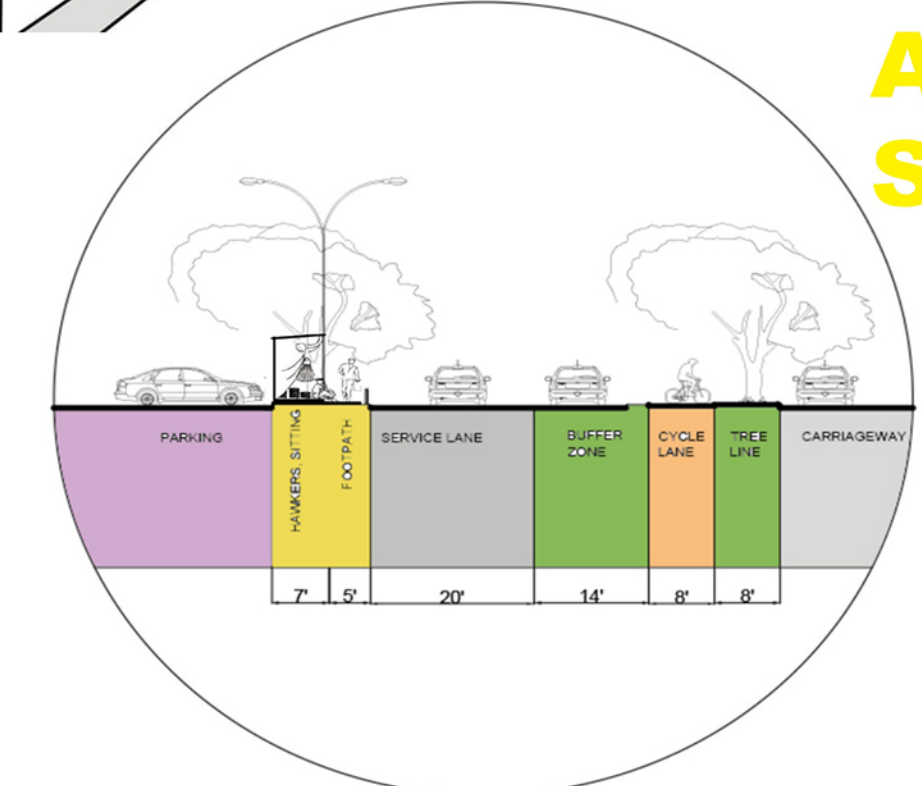
- Better use of underutilised space. Leftover space b/w parking of showrooms and V2B road.

- Formalising already existing furniture zone with hawkers, street furniture and separate space for footpath with access to people of different ability.



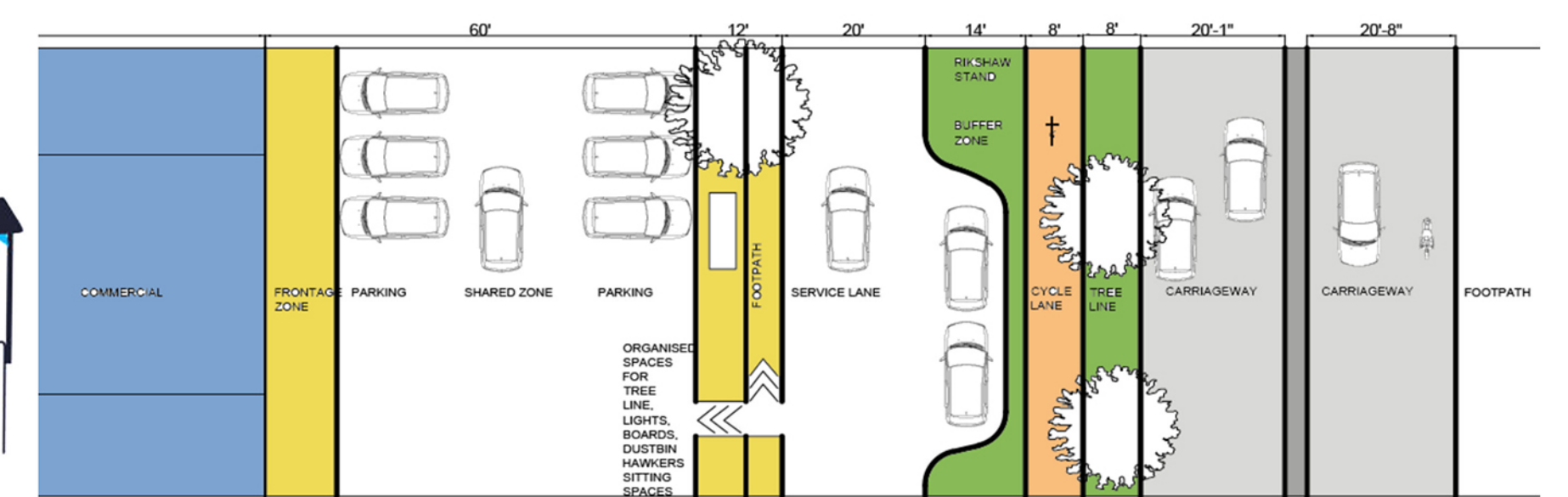
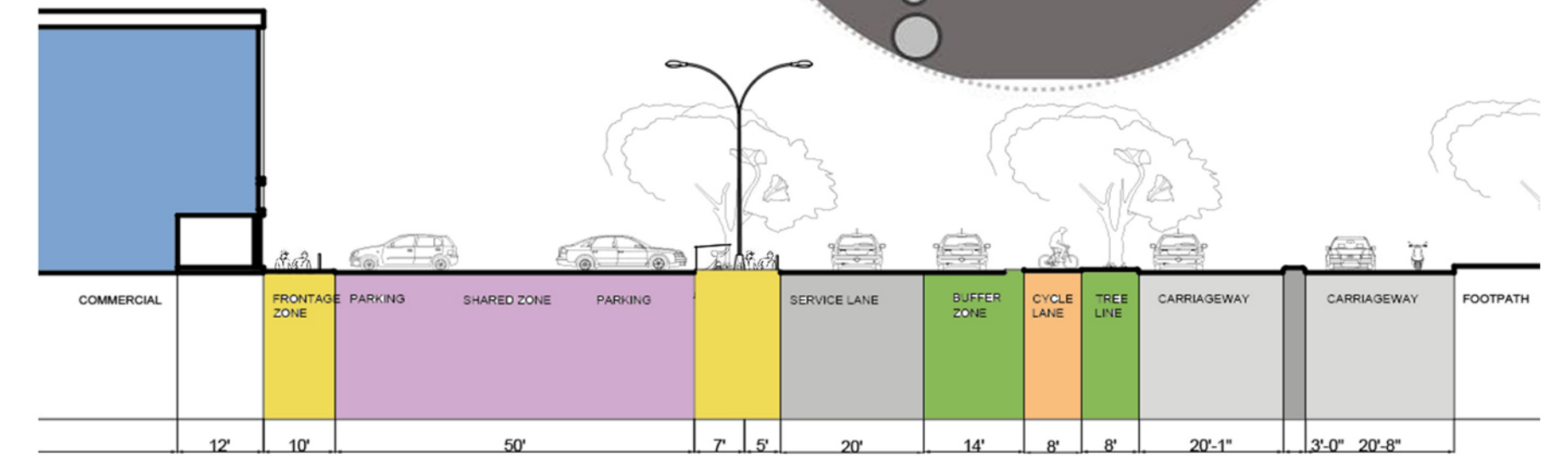
### ACTIVATING THE SPACE
